**Detergent**  
 Mix 1 teaspoon of clear dishwashing liquid to 1 cup of water

**Vinegar**  
 Use undiluted white vinegar

**Ammonia**  
 Use undiluted household ammonia

**Dry Cleaning Solvent**  
 (eg. turpentine)

**Nail Polish Remover**  
 Non-Oily, preferably acetone base

**Ice Cube**  
 Ice Cube then once frozen shatter wax into pieces

**Vacuum**  
 Vacuum (when product has hardened)

**Lukewarm Water**  
 Tepid water

**Cold Water**  
 From refrigerator

**Note: Use a clean white cloth and press dry between each step**

The above chart is a guide and recommendations only for stain removal. The removal of the stains may not be 100% successful. If unsuccessful, we recommend that you contact a professional carpet cleaner immediately.

### Vacuum Regularly

Vacuuming often is wool's best friend. This is the most effective and economical way to remove soil and dirt particles before they become embedded into the carpet pile. You can not over vacuum and vacuuming should begin the day the wall-to-wall carpet, runner or area rug is installed.

For a Flat Weave carpet use a beater bar brush for best results.

### Spot & Stain Removal

- Blot up liquids with paper towels or an absorbent cloth and scoop up any solids.
- See "Stain Removal Guide" for the recommended spot removal process.
- Work inward from the edge of the spot to prevent excess spreading. Do not rub, as this may cause the spot to spread.
- Do not saturate with water.
- Blot dry between each step as indicated on the "Stain Removal Guide."

### Preventative Measures

- Use absorbant mats at every entrance to your home to prevent tracking in dirt.
- Regularly change filters in your heating and air conditioning systems.

### Periodic Maintenance

- Use a reputable wool carpet professional to do a thorough cleaning periodically to remove the deepest soils. There are several deep cleaning methods you can use to ensure the beauty and life of your wool carpet, rug or stair runner.
